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IPEC partnered with the Association of Academic Health Sciences Libraries to conduct a review of published literature linking IPE to a direct improvement in quality of patient care, plus other health outcomes.

The question was: Has the inclusion of interprofessional education in healthcare curricula had a direct impact on quality of patient care? In December 2023, the related manuscript was published in the *Journal of Interprofessional Care*.

IPEC Institutional Assessment Instrument



IPEC partnered with the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio to develop a tool that leverages the IPEC competency framework to identify institutional characteristics tied to successful implementation of programmatic IPE.

Leaders of academic institutions are encouraged to utilize the 20-item IPEC Institutional Assessment Instrument alongside the 105 expert-generated consensus statements it is based upon to assess their institutional capacity for high-quality programmatic IPE and to plan for quality improvement.

Reflecting on ten years of experience, the National Center leaders recognize the need for Nexus transformation and the relevance of the NexusIPE[™] Learning Model today as education and health systems grapple with mounting workforce challenges. The model provides opportunities to address growing workforce shortages, provide equitable care that leads to health, and support the well-being of practice teams in the face of challenges such as the COVID-19 pandemic.
