Integrating the New IPEC Core Competencies into IPE Curriculum

The core competencies developed by IPEC were first adopted in 2011 followed by updates in 2016 and 2023. This session reviews significant changes in the latest version of the IPEC competencies, discusses how to use this material to meet accreditation requirements related to interprofessional education, and reviews promising practices for incorporating the competencies into your IPE programs.
